The close of this academic year marks a new beginning for the Lawrence Technological University community. The Board of Trustees' approved adding a fifth college, The College of Health Sciences.

This will house current programs such as nursing, physician assistant with a link to the College of Engineering for Biomedical Engineering and Cardiovascular Perfusion. In the next three years we will be adding a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy, a Doctorate of Physical Therapy and Doctorate of Pharmacy.
