Gaming console connection FAQ

For the best performance, please use the LTU Guest network to connect all gaming consoles. (Also use LTU Guest for smart phones, iPads, tablets and other similar devices)

While many users have been able to connect their consoles to the LTU Guest network successfully, some revisions of the current generation of game consoles do not support communicating on enterprise-class networks. There is a workaround that some students have been able to use to get their systems connected to the network.



If you are having difficulty connecting your gaming console to the LTU Guest network, please try the follow procedure to share your laptop's internet connection:

- 1. Power off your gaming console and connect it to your laptop with an Ethernet cable.
- 2. Right click the wireless icon on your laptop and click Open Network and Sharing Center
- 3. Click "Change adapter settings" on the left side of the window that opens.
- 4. Right click your wireless adapter and click Properties.
- 5. Click the Sharing tab and check the box that says "Allow other network users to connect through this computer's Internet connection".
- 6. Click OK and power on your gaming console.
- 7. You should now have a connection through your gaming console's wired connection.
